Location

Leeds, United Kingdom

The recreational and social facilities at Leeds Met are excellent. Leeds is an exciting and lively city, large enough to have many leisure activities, yet small enough to have everything within easy reach. The county of Yorkshire has a reputation for friendliness, and is located in the centre of the UK – making it easy to visit other cities in the UK and use direct air links to several European cities, so weekends in Paris, Amsterdam or Barcelona for example are easy and relatively inexpensive.



Accommodation costs

Costs vary for different types of accommodation and facilities; typically rent is between $\pounds62-\pounds105$ per week. Higher priced accommodation usually comprises en-suite facilities and some University residences have gym facilities.

Costs

The cost of living in Leeds is lower than other parts of the UK, particularly London and the south. Don't forget that you'll also get a student discount at many shops, restaurants, cinemas, clubs and you can also take advantage of the Leeds Card, offering a huge range of benefits for a tiny annual fee.

Currency

The United Kingdom monetary system is based on the pound sterling. The pound is divided into 100 pence (pennies). All transactions are made using coins in denominations of 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50 pence and 1, and bills in denominations of 5, 10, 20, and 50 pounds.



Visas

All US nationals require a visa/entry clearance to study in the UK, even if you are coming to the UK for 6 months or less. If you do not have the correct entry clearance or visa then you will not be allowed to enter the UK and may be asked to return home. It is important you enter the UK on a student/prospective student visa as the immigration rules do not allow visa nationals to change visa status to that of student whilst in the UK.
