Font, Margins, spacing (all pages) <i>See pages 228-9.</i>	Use Times New Roman, 12 point font. Margins are 1 inch (do this by clicking on the “Page Layout” tab in Microsoft Word). Double Space all text by selecting “paragraph” in Word.	This handout meets these specifications <i>except</i> the examples are in 9 point font and not all the text is double-spaced.
Headers & Title page (page 1)  <i>See pages 23 &amp; 229-30.</i>	<p>1. The header on the title page is “Running head:” + your essay’s title in all caps. The header on this handout is an example. For each page following, do not include “Running head.”</p> <hr/> <p>2. Title, your name, and institution are centered in the top half of the title page. Abstract (page 2)  <i>See pages 25-27.</i>	1. The “Abstract,” or summary of the essay, is typically page 2. Published essays in APA require an abstract, but professors may not require it for certain assignments. If you are unsure, just ask.	<p style="text-align: center;">Abstract</p> <p>This essay covers the history of APA at Bellarmine. It is designed to give users, particularly those at the graduate-level in education, nursing, and communication, a basic overview. The current rules and page numbers referenced are from the <i>Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association</i>, Sixth Edition.</p>
Sections and subsections in essay’s body (begins on page 3)  <i>See page 62 (subheadings 1-5)</i>	<p>1. Page 3 begins with the title centered (not in bold). Do not use “Introduction” as a beginning subheading.</p> <hr/> <p>2. Subheadings divide your essay into sections. The 1<sup>st</sup> subheading level is formatted as centered, bold. For a section within that subheading, formatting is flushed left, bold.
